When someone falls in a race ENCOURAGE them to get back up.

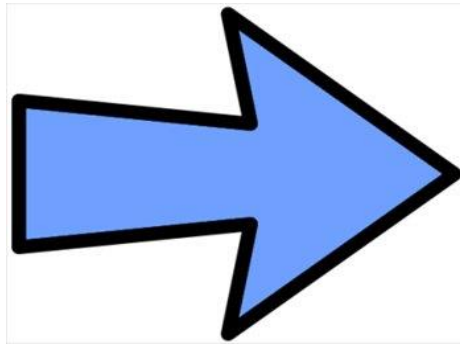
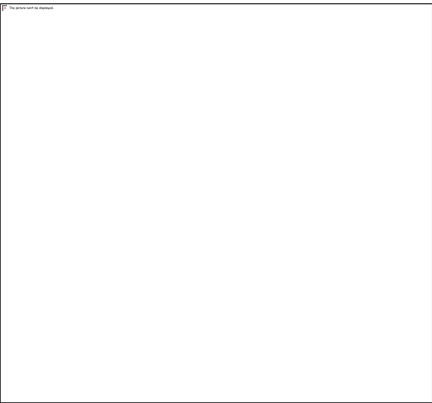
When you knock over someone's ice-cream you say sorry.

When someone asks you to play and you say no that's excluding.

E = Excluding

Excluding someone is a very unkind way of rejecting a person.

A = Argumentative
